From the Pastor. We can learn a lot about how to use the Bible by observing how those in the Scripture use the Word that was available to them. In Daniel chapter 9, he is reading Jeremiah and learns that the captivity he is experiencing is supposed to last seventy years. He then realizes that the seventy years are nearly complete and that he had better get ready. Getting ready is more than about packing bags; it involves preparing hearts. As a result, this chapter includes both a prayer and a very specific revelation about the coming of Christ. In one chapter there is both prayer and hope in the darkness of those times. First, we have a **PATTERN FOR PRAYER**. The three main points are:

1. We should base our prayer on God's **WORD**.
2. We should guide our prayer with God's **WAYS**
3. We should submit our prayer to God's **WILL**

Look up! For days after our lightning strike and equipment damage, I never bothered to look up and see the damage to the steeple. (There must be a spiritual lesson there somewhere!) What you can see from the ground is a hole in the side, the spire is opened at the seam, one louvered vent was blown off and the other bent at the bottom. What you don't see is the hole in the roof.
